# What does the board of trustees do?

Our division is governed by a board of nine trustees who are accountable to the public for the safety, quality, and cost of education via human resource practices, policies, and budgetary decisions. Trustees are elected every four years during municipal elections; the most recent held on October 26, 2022.

The board meets the first and third Tuesday of each month.

All decisions are made by the board of trustees as a group. The choices they make include setting policy, establishing priorities, and setting the division budget. Trustees are motivated by their desire to serve their community.

The board of trustees has three standing committees, a liaison committee, and other committees that meet regularly to take a more in-depth look and deliberate on their area of responsibility. Committee members and chairs are elected at the board's inaugural meeting each year.

One of the committees is the finance, facilities, and transportation committee. Members work with the secretary-treasurer and other committees to look at annual statements, confirm payments, and deal with matters regarding the use of school facilities and transportation of pupils.

Ultimately, the board of trustees is a group of individuals with strong connections to the River East Transcona community who want to represent your voice when governing the division.
