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GENERAL SCHOOL NEWS

School Wide Positive Behaviour

One of our goals at Munroe is for all staff to engage in proactive strategies and programs that support a respectful, inclusive school culture. Staff are continuing to develop the school-wide positive behaviour plan; the emphasis in 2012-2013 was on hallway expectations and this year we are focusing on classroom expectations.

On October 22, students attended and participated in a school-wide assembly. Each homeroom entered with their student-created classroom banners and cheered when their class names were read out for the audience. Students then watched a school-made video which presented the expectations set out in the Classroom Expectation posters (in English/French) and are now posted in each class.

The expectations for each strand (respect, responsibility and safety) were taught to students on three consecutive days. In order to offer reinforcement for positive behaviour, progress, and success, students received tickets if they demonstrated the behaviours focused on. Each homeroom teacher did a morning draw and five students received Munroe pencils; these names were then placed in grade-level bins for a classroom draw. The students of 7E (Mme Lepine), 8A (Ms. MacGregor) and 9A (Mr. Bezte) received the grand prize of \$50.00 to be used towards their classroom. Congratulations to all! Our school will continue to build on the virtues of respect, responsibility, and safety, throughout the school year.

Our French Immersion students will be grouped into multi-grade groups, allowing them to mix and mingle with other FI students while engaging in authentic French conversation. How to successfully learn a new language

Our philosophy is that a student best learns an additional language by consistently communicating and studying in that language. We recognize that to become bilingual, we need to practice our French language skills at every available opportunity. For our students, learning a second language requires effort and commitment. For us, helping students to develop a sound working knowledge of the French language is a priority.

As parents and teachers, we need to work in partnership in order to encourage our students to regularly use French at every available opportunity. In the end, it is the students who will benefit from our commitment to this goal. The expectation is that students communicate in French in class, in the hallways, during in-school and out-of-school activities and with all of their French Immersion teachers.

To help your child improve their French language skills you can:

- Talk to them about why your family chose late entry French Immersion
- Express your interest in the French language and French culture
- Take them to French cultural activities like the French-Canadian pavilion at Folklorama or the Festival du Voyageur in February
- Visit the French section of the public library
- Watch a French TV show, listen to a French radio station such as Envol 91.1 FM or tune into the French track of a DVD
- Listen to them speak and read in French and comment on their progress
- Encourage their participation in class and to be engaged learners
- Set aside regular homework time so your child can review the vocabulary by practicing their pronunciation in addition to completing any assigned work
- Encourage them to take risks when they speak and to always speak French with their teachers...
