#### **BUS EVACUATION DRILLS**

#### MASKS ARE REQUIRED FOR ALL STUDENTS DURING BUS EVACUATIONS

The Public Schools Act, P250-R.M. 465/88 R - Pupil Instruction, states the following:

"The school board shall ensure that at least twice in each school year each pupil is instructed in safe school bus riding practices and participates in emergency school bus evacuation drills which shall be conducted at least once during the fall term and at least once during the spring term of each school year."

The River East Transcona Transportation Department has an excellent safety record. In maintaining this record, we carry out Bus Evacuation programs in all of our schools in the early fall and late spring of each school year.

These practice drills are carried out so that in the event of an emergency, our students can evacuate the bus as quickly and safely as possible.

The safety of our children is of the utmost importance and must be given first consideration.

# Halloween Information For Families

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Our staff are already anticipating Halloween activities for students and are thinking creatively about how to keep students safe and healthy, while still enjoying the day together. We are thinking about "safety over convenience" as we celebrate Halloween on a smaller scale.

#### For Friday October 29, 2021

• Teachers will be creating Fall and/or Halloween experiences and activities to be done throughout the day that include curricular connections.

• We will not be having a whole school Halloween Parade to prevent cohorts from crossing paths and to ensure we follow the guidelines from the province of reducing the number of people that gather. Students will be able to see the costumes that other students are wearing within their own classroom setting. Classroom Teachers <u>may</u> arrange for grade level cohorts to share their costumes during the day. Unfortunately, we are not able to have any visitors in the school at this time.

• Please do not send any treats/goodie bags/packages for your child to share with their classmates. While we appreciate generosity, we want to limit the amount of items our students will be handling.

- Teachers <u>may</u> bring in a prepackaged snack for their whole class to enjoy at school. Items will be properly wiped down and hands will be sanitized beforehand as needed before distribution occurs. Teachers will not be providing any treats/goodie bags/packages for their students to take home to limit the amount of items our students will be handling.
- Students are welcome to bring their own special snack from home for the celebrations that Teachers will be having in their classrooms. Keep in mind that we continue to be a nut free school.

• If your child chooses to wear a costume, they must wear the costume to school for the entire day. We want to prevent moments where many students are using the washrooms for changing. If your child goes home for lunch, you may wish to have them change into their costume when at home.

• For our Kindergartens that attend school on alternate even days, their Fall and/or Halloween experiences will occur on Thursday October 28, 2021 or Friday October 29, 2021 and will also follow the guidelines noted.

Our Physical Education staff will be playing some Fall and/or Halloween games during Physical Education classes during the week leading up to Halloween.

Please remember the following guidelines when selecting a costume for your child:

- Costumes must be appropriate for K-5 students within a school setting.
- Costumes and accessories cannot be violent in nature (e.g. knives, blood, swords, axes, guns, etc.). Please leave any costume props at home. Please do any necessary preparations at home (face paint or hair).

• Costumes will be worn during recess and speciality classes. Please ensure the costume is comfortable, easy to move in and will fit under a jacket.

• Costumes must not be graphic in nature (e.g. inappropriate sayings displayed that would not align with our divisional dress code).

• Costume masks cannot be worn, as students need to be recognizable and students will already be wearing masks as outlined by the province. We want students to have clear lines of vision for safety reasons.

Please have a conversation with your child(ren) regarding new regulations for Halloween. Although it will be on a smaller scale, we are happy to still be able to offer something to commemorate this event.



# **Reminder to Parents and Patrols**

With the cold weather almost here, I would like to remind the patrols to dress accordingly. Try to be prepared for cold weather. You will be expected to patrol during these cold days.

The division cold weather policy is as follows:

Temperature and wind chill based on info from The Forks.

Temperature and wind chill factor are both used to determine the times below.

-27° C to -34° C
-35° C to -40° C
Time on post not to exceed 10 minutes. (Warm clothing is essential.)
Time on post not to exceed 5 minutes.
(Distances more than a five-minute walk from the school will not be patrolled.
All of our posts are within a five-minute walk to the school.)
Below -40°C
No student patrols on post.

When there are no patrols on post, parents are responsible for making sure that students arrive into the school safely.

We usually have a patrol meeting once a month to talk about issues facing patrols, celebrations, patrol training, awards and treats and patrol news.

### Allergies



As in the past, there are several students with life threatening allergies in the school. Specific information letters have been sent home with the appropriate classes. We work very hard to provide a safe environment for all students. However, we would like to ask all families to consider the following in the interest of safety:

- Contact with even a tiny amount of an allergen can cause a severe reaction.
- Nuts are the most common allergen in the school (especially peanuts).
- Check the labels on food products that are sent to sent to school (avoid all nut products).
- Do not send peanut butter or Nutella sandwiches or items outlined in your child's classroom information letter.

Thank you for helping to keep the school safe as possible for all of our students.

Please remember to send a spoon or a fork for any snack or lunch items that your child brings to school. Our Lunch Program does not supply students with utensils.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Your son/daughter's safety is very important to us. We have policies and procedures in place at both the divisional and school level to support their safety. In the past, our school division has worked with the Winnipeg Police Service, (as well as referencing materials from the RCMP and Manitoba Education and Advanced Learning), to review and strengthen the procedures we have in place to protect students and staff in the event of a safety threat at school. We would like to share details of these procedures with you now.

Safety procedures fall into two categories: Hold and Secure and Lockdown.

**Hold and Secure** will be activated if there is a *potential threat outside the school*. In these situations, the police typically contact the school and direct the school to go into Hold and Secure. When there is no longer a threat outside the school building, the police inform us that we can resume regular activities.

If our school is in Hold and Secure, the following procedures will apply:

- All exterior doors will be locked.
- NO ENTRY signs will be placed on each door.
- No one will be permitted to leave or enter the school until school administration announces that Hold and Secure is over.

**Lockdown** will be activated if there is a *potential threat inside the school building*. If the school is in Lockdown, the following procedures will apply:

- All students and staff will proceed to the nearest classroom or office.
- All doors to classrooms and offices will be locked and/or barricaded by the supervising adult.
- Students will be kept away from windows and doors and instructed to remain silent and still.
- No one will be permitted to leave their room until the Lockdown is over.

All schools in RETSD are required to hold at least two Lockdown and two Hold and Secure practice drills each school year. The purpose of the drills is to provide training for staff and students so everyone knows what to do in the event of a safety threat. Everyone in the school building will participate in these drills. Students, staff and parents will be informed in advance of these practice drills.

If your son/daughter arrives at school during a Hold and Secure or Lockdown procedure, he or she must proceed to the school evacuation site, sign in and remain there until directed otherwise by administration or police.

If you arrive at the school during a Hold and Secure or Lockdown, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO ENTER THE SCHOOL. For serious situations, please proceed to the parent/guardian information site where divisional personnel will arrive as soon as possible to assist you. The parent information site for your son/daughter's school is:

#### Westview School (600 Hoka Street)

If you hear about a serious emergency at your son/daughter's school through media reports or other means, DO NOT PROCEED TO THE SCHOOL. Instead, proceed to the parent information site identified above.

Please DO NOT CALL YOUR SON/DAUGHTER'S S CELL PHONE during an emergency, particularly in a Lockdown situation where it is critical to remain silent and still and not draw attention from any threat makers that may be in the building.

In closing, our purpose in sending this letter is to reassure you that we regularly review our divisional safety procedures to ensure that we are doing our best to maintain the safety of your son/daughter's learning environment. We do this through proactive planning and practise of emergency procedures in all of our schools.

- Fatigue
- Conjunctivitis (pink eye)
- Headache
- Skin rash of unknown cause
- Nausea or loss of appetite
- Poor feeding (if an infant)

### When Can My Child Return to School?

If your child gets tested for COVID-19 and is:



**Negative:** They can return to school after 24 hours of being symptom-free.

**Positive:** Public Health will provide guidance regarding what is required before your child can return to school.

If your child is sick and you decide not to get tested for COVID-19 the student must self-isolate for 10 days from symptom onset plus 24 hours of being symptom-free before returning to school.



# When Can Students Attend School?

Children who are well should go to school—that means they have none of the symptoms of COVID-19. Students who have unwell siblings can stay in school, provided they are well and have no symptoms of COVID-19 themselves.

#### FULLY VACCINATED STUDENTS must stay home if they...

- Are unwell or showing symptoms of COVID-19
- Are waiting for results of a COVID-19 test
- Have tested positive for COVID-19
- Have been directed by Public Health to self-isolate

# UNVACCINATED OR PARTIALLY VACCINATED STUDENTS must stay home if they...

- · Are unwell or showing symptoms of COVID-19
- Are waiting for results of a COVID-19 test
- Have tested positive for COVID-19
- Are a close contact to a positive COVID-19 case
- Have a household member who has tested positive for COVID-19
- · Have been directed by Public Health to self-isolate
- Have personally travelled outside of Manitoba in the last 14 days\*
- Have a household member who has travelled outside of Manitoba in the last 14 days and is now sick with COVID-19 symptoms

\*Unless Public Health communicates otherwise to the school principal
