- We have had a very successful start to our school year. We have 1192 students at REC. (Grade 9 267, Grade 10 266, Grade 11 321, and Grade 12 320, SS 18). We welcomed the students on the first day with Teacher Advisor activities and a BBQ lunch. We held assemblies where we shared our expectations for the year with students and welcomed them back.
- 2. We held our meet the teacher evening on September 12 and had standing room only in our theatre to begin the evening. We very much appreciated the parents who joined us for the evening and thank them for taking the time to meet with us.
- 3. We celebrated our students who achieved honor roll status for the 2016-2017 school year on September 21. We presented students with a certificate and a snack to celebrate their achievements. We had one of our counsellors join us to talk about future planning and scholarship opportunities as well. Student names are posted on our honor roll board outside of the office.
- 4. The government proclaimed September 25 to 29th as School Support Staff Recognition Week. We provided our staff with snacks and coffee on the 28th to celebrate.
- 5. October 2 was a division wide in-service where all RETSD staff participated in a wide variety of Professional Development opportunities. It was an excellent day to collaborate with our colleagues and to expand our learning.
