The students are just finishing up the annual Winnipeg Harvest food and money drive, to support this local cause during a time of great need. A huge thank you goes out to Don and Marilyn from Chicken Chef of St. Malo. Their generous support of the chicken wing hot lunch fundraiser was instrumental in helping us reach our goal. #### Le Musée du Manitoba



On February 19<sup>th</sup>, our grade 7 students enjoyed a trip to le Musée du Manitoba. They participated in three activities: the Nonsuch Gallery Tour, The Rocket Science Gallery and the film "Ice World" at the planetarium. The Nonsuch Gallery Tour was an activity that had students travel back in time to Deptford England to experience the life of a 17<sup>th</sup> century sailor bound for the New World.

The Rocket Science Gallery allowed students to explore the science behind rockets which included action-reaction and the forces of flight and combustion.

#### Semaine par excellence

Each year two grade 9 French Immersion students get to experience a week of university life at Universite de St. Boniface. This year Judith Culanag and Andrej Kao will be there from April 22 to 26. They will participate in various French language university courses throughout the week and will meet other French Immersion Rivereast Transcona students also.

#### Québec trip May 2013

We've just had our second last Québec trip meeting. We shared the itinerary of activities that our students will experience in Québec City and Montréal. Our group is made up of 44 grade 8 and 9 students from both our French Immersion and English programs as well as six teachers. This seven day trip is in mid-May 2013 and we are all very excited about visiting museums, eating in French restaurants, shopping, seeing the beautiful countryside and learning about French history and



culture. The trip is offered in French with French tour guides as well as French speaking bus drivers. All students will have an authentic opportunity to increase their French language skills.

#### Looking Ahead.....

Well the end of the year is approaching and we thank our French Immersion parents for having chosen to provide your children with a unique opportunity to benefit from the French Immersion experience. Our philosophy is that a student best learns a second language by consistently communicating and studying in that language. We recognize that to become bilingual, we need to practice our French language skills at every available opportunity. For our students, learning a second language requires effort and commitment. For us, helping students to develop a sound working knowledge of the French language is a priority.



As parents and teachers, we need to work in partnership in order to encourage our students to regularly use French at every available opportunity. In the end, it is the students who will benefit from our commitment to this goal. The expectation is that students attempt to communicate in French in class, in the hallways, during in-school and out of school activities and with all of their French Immersion teachers.

To help your child improve their French language skills you can:

- Talk to them about why your family chose late entry French Immersion
- Express your interest in the French language and French culture
- Express your support by asking your child to teach you some French words they are learning
- Take them to French cultural activities like the French-Canadian pavilion at Folklarama
- Visit the French section of the public library
- Watch a French TV show, listen to a French radio station such as Envol 91.1 FM or tune into the French track of a DVD
- Listen to them speak and read in French and comment on their progress
- Encourage them to take risks when they speak and to always speak French with their teachers
