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## **GENERAL SCHOOL NEWS**

### **School-Wide Positive Behavior**

One of our goals at Munroe is for all staff to engage in proactive strategies and programs that support a respectful, inclusive school culture. Staff are continuing to develop the school-wide positive behaviour plan.

While continuing to teach and practice hallway expectations, the primary focus this year has been on school-wide classroom expectations. A second 'Classroom Blitz' occurred during the week of January 20<sup>th</sup>. During extended homeroom time in the mornings, teachers reviewed the expectations under each strand (Respect, Responsibility and Safety) and had students assess how well they were doing in each of the areas; once areas in need of improvement were identified, classes discussed what these behaviors should look, sound and feel like. Throughout the week, teachers would distribute tickets to students who demonstrated the expected positive behaviors. Tickets were placed in grade-level bins for a draw for individual and classroom rewards. Congratulations to Evgeniy and Jeremiah (7A), Caiyi (8A), Aleah (8D), Devin (9A), and Sage (9D) who each won a pair of Canadian Olympic mittens. The classroom winners were 7A (Ms. Boutroucas), 8D (Mme. Jackson) and 9D (Mme. Leveillé). Each homeroom received \$50.00 towards a mutually-decided-upon reward for their class.

On February 18<sup>th</sup>, all Munroe students participated in the Live Different motivational presentation. Through music, videos and live presentations, the troop engaged students in the idea that their life has value and that they can make a significant difference in the world. The theme was "It Starts Here - Kindness Changes Everything". After the highly-motivating presentation, students returned to their homerooms and had an opportunity for discussion to extend on the ideas they had just heard.

This year, the Munroe staff is also involved in a book study to broaden and enrich their knowledge of research-based proactive strategies around learning and behaving; the book is entitled: *Classroom Management That Works: Research Based Strategies for Every Teacher* by Robert J. Marzano.

Outdoor activities had been planned, but due to the frigid temperatures, indoor events such as games, flag tag, cookie baking and a school-designed biathlon took place. ### I Love to Read Week



From February 24 to 28, students celebrated 'I Love to Read' week by participating in a variety of activities and contests. Each morning, students and staff had the opportunity to "drop everything and read" for a 20-minute block of time. Each afternoon, students listened to the first line of a well-known book. If an individual knew the title, they put their name in to win one of five \$10.00 Scholastic gift certificates. Congratulations to Hudson H. (7D), Saron L. (7D), Adam L. (9D.), Jordanna S. Something new this year was our 'Guess the Reader' contest. Staff members were photographed behind their favourite books and the photos posted for all to see. Munroe is participating once again in the Red River Ex 'Read and Win' program. If students read for 30 minutes for any 20 days (the days do not have to be consecutive) from January 19 to April 15, 2014 and have this signed off by a parent or guardian, they will receive two free admission passes to the Red River Ex!

### **Project Tomatosphere**

Our grade 9 students will once again be participating in Project Tomatosphere. Tomatosphere is an educational outreach project involving more than 17,000 classrooms in Canada and the United States. The project uses the excitement of space exploration as a medium for teaching students about science, space and agriculture and the role being played by Canada as a world leader in the support of long-term space flight.

Students will be conducting a germination experiment in a "blind" test that will utilize two sets of tomato seeds. There is a control group and a set of seeds that have been on the International Space Station (ISS) for a period of 22 months. The seeds were taken to the ISS on the last shuttle (July, 2011) and

returned to Earth with Commander Chris Hadfield on May 15, 2013 on board a Russian Soyuz vehicle. One group of seeds that the students will germinate has travelled in excess of 450 million kilometers!

### **Career Symposium**

Our Grade 9's attended the Rotary Career Symposium on March 18th, 2014 to explore their options for secondary education, apprenticeship programs and careers.

## French Immersion News

### Concours d'Art Oratoire

Our 'Concours d'Art Oratoire' French-speaking competition is coming up in April, 2013. Good luck goes out to all of our FI students who will first be judged at the school level. After our competition, three students will then move on to perform at the divisional level, and from there, the winners will participate in the provincial competition.

### Fingerweaving

All French Immersion and Basic French students attended a fingerweaving workshop February 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> in our library. This workshop was led by Carol James who is an expert in fingerweaving techniques and is the author of the book "Fingerweaving Untangled". Ms. James has given workshops across North America and Europe and has created replica sashes for diverse customers, including the Manitoba Museum and Parks Canada. She has served as a



private consultant in ancient textile techniques for archaeologists.

Diverse intelligences, eye-hand coordination, interpersonal skills and spacial sense were exercised. Connections were made to various curriculums such as history, aboriginal studies, socials skills, artistic creation and math.

### Québec trip May, 2015

Over 25 students have recently enrolled the Quebec trip and we are all very excited about visiting museums, eating in French restaurants, shopping, seeing the beautiful countryside and learning about French history and culture. This trip is offered in French with French tour guides as well as French-speaking bus drivers. All students will have an authentic opportunity to increase their French language skills.

### Looking Ahead.....

Well, the end of the year is approaching and we thank you for having chosen to provide your children with a unique opportunity to benefit from the French Immersion experience. Our philosophy is that a student best learns a second language by consistently communicating and studying in that language. We recognize that to become bilingual, we need to practice our French language skills at every available opportunity. For our students, learning a second language requires effort and commitment; for us, helping students to develop a sound working knowledge of the French language is a priority.



As parents and teachers, we need to work in partnership in order to encourage our students to regularly use French at every available opportunity; in the end, it is the students who will benefit from our commitment to this goal. The expectation is that students attempt to communicate in French in class, in the hallways, during in-school and out-of-school activities and with all of their French Immersion teachers.

To help your child improve their French language skills you can:

- talk to them about why your family chose late entry French Immersion
- express your interest in the French language and French culture
- express your support by asking your child to teach you some French words they are learning
- take them to French cultural activities like the French-Canadian pavilion at Folklarama
- visit the French section of the public library
- watch a French TV show, listen to a French radio station such as Envol 91.1 FM or tune into the French track of a DVD
- listen to them speak and read in French and comment on their progress
- encourage them to take risks when they speak and to always speak French with their teachers
