Positive School-Wide Behaviour – Respect in Hallways

One of Munroe's school-wide behaviour expectations is *listening to and following adult instructions*. During an extended homeroom, teachers reviewed this expectation with their students and had them explain what this behaviour should look like and sound like. If students were caught following this expectation during unstructured periods of time (entering and exiting the building, class transitions), they were rewarded with a treat ticket which could be exchanged for a snack. Having staff show, tell, practice, and reinforce school-wide expectations increases positive behaviour.


We're making the move!

2016-2017 High School Information:

The Grade 8 and 9 students from Munroe Junior High will be transitioning to the high schools for the 2016-2017 school year. The staff at Munroe, along with the high schools and divisional staff, have been addressing students and parents' questions and concerns for the last few months. With that being said, Grade 8 and Grade 9 students will be having classroom talks around course selections, registration and what to expect for their high school experience in the following weeks to come.

Grade 8 and Grade 9 students will be given *registration packages on February 2nd and 3rd* for any high schools they may be interested in.
